ENVIRONMENTAL FILM FESTIVAL OPENS IN DOMINICAN REPUBLIC



The fourth edition of the Dominican Republic's Environmental Film Festival, or DREFF, opened Wednesday, screening films in 11 cities across the Caribbean nation. The DREFF started in 2011 with an attendance of 2,000, growing to 10,000 filmgoers last year, festival director Natasha Despotovic told EFE. "For us, it's very important to use film as an educational medium to raise awareness and promote better public policies, and greater social action and behavior by the private sector.
